Clifford Branch is a Houston native who attended Evan E. Worthing High School from 1964-67 and participated in football and track, coached by Clint Williams and Oliver "Show" Brown. Branch was All-District in football (1966), but was also the first schoolboy in Texas history to run the 100-yard dash in 9.3 seconds. He was the state champion in the 100-yard dash (1965) and the 220-yard dash (1966) and was inducted to the Texas High School Hall of Fame in 2004.

Branch attended the University of Colorado where he was an All-American wide receiver (1971) the 1972 NCAA 100-meter champion with a record time of 10.0. He has been recognized as part of CU's all-century football team. Branch was selected in the fourth round of the National Football League Draft by the Oakland Raiders and played his entire pro career (1972-85) with the team, including three Super Bowl titles. He was named first-team All-Pro three times and finished his career with 501 receptions for 8,685 yards and 67 touchdowns.

Retired, he does charity work and enjoys tennis and golf. He resides in the Northern California Bay Area.
