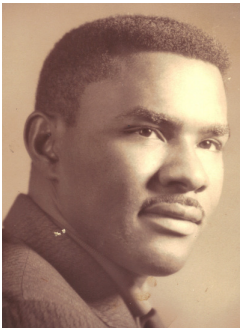

That same year, as team captain, he led the Panthers to their only PVIL state track championship.

George Raft Arnold graduated in 1960 from L.C. Anderson HS in Austin. He played both offense and defense as a right guard and middle linebacker and never came out of a game. Opposing teams knew it was important to contain Arnold but were seldom successful.

Arnold lettered as a junior and senior and was team captain his senior season and helped the Yellow Jackets to district titles in 1958 and 1959.

He worked for 30 years at Brackenridge Hospital and 37 more years at the Texas Department of Public Safety, retiring from both jobs.
