John Earl Lee was born in Baytown and raised in the all-black community of McNair. John attended Harlem Elementary School in McNair and Carver HS in Baytown, graduating in 1963. He was a member of the 1961 football state championship team as a defensive lineman and the 1962 track & field championship team. Lee received a football scholarship to Wiley College in 1963 and was a starter.

In 1969, he began working for the E. I. DuPont Co. in 1969 as an operator, where he received several promotions and retired after 39 years of service.

Lee and the love of his life, Carole Sanders-Lee, have been married for 47 years after meeting at Wiley. They have one daughter, Kelley Deajon (John Deajon - Husband) and two grandchildren, Bria and Kameron Deajon. Lee has been a member of Mt.
